Students and teachers from all Broward's high schools, private and charter high schools will have the opportunity to meet and hear eyewitness testimony of survivors of the Holocaust who will share their personal experiences. With the widespread terrorism in our world today, this program has become more significant and appropriate in sensitizing students to the dangers of discrimination, bigotry, and hatred.

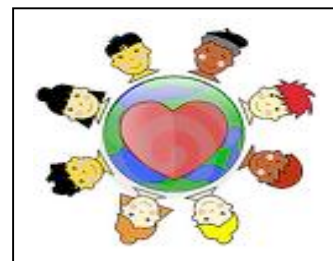

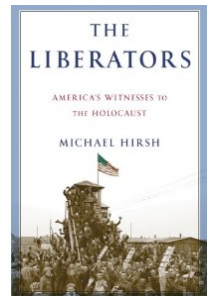
